## Treatment

The Hicksville Counseling Center has three phases of treatment:

**PHASE I:** The focus is on early recovery issues such as becoming abstinent.

**PHASE II:** The focus is on relapse prevention and assisting our clients to learn how to live a balanced, substance abuse free lifestyle.

**PHASE III:** Aftercare is available for those wanting/needing to continue treatment after completing Phases I & II.

### ADOLESCENT GROUP

- Geared to provide both education and treatment for kids between the ages of 12 – 18.

### CHRONIC RELAPSE TRACK

- This track is offered to clients who have experienced previous treatment attempts but are still struggling with maintaining abstinence. The goal is relapse to recovery. Medication to reduce cravings is available.

We also offer on-site Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous and Al-Anon meetings.

## Outpatient services

- Intake, assessment and when indicated, referral
- Individual and group counseling
- Education curriculums
- Counseling for children and significant others of substance abusers
- 12-Step groups available on premises
- Family, marital and couples counseling
- Relapse prevention
- Psychiatric evaluation and medication supervision

## Staff

The staff of HCC is a multi-disciplinary, culturally competent team comprised of a psychiatrist, state certified social workers, credentialed alcohol and substance abuse counselors (CASAC), and a certified family therapist. The administrative support staff are warm and professionally trained to speak with callers and set up appointments as conveniently as possible.
